

Pupil Premium Strategy 2018-19

For the academic year 2018-19 The Garden school received £101, 700

The main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils at the school are many and complex and include those relating to their autism and also to their family circumstances

- Communication and language skills (social communication and interaction)
- Ability to self-regulate and sensory needs
- Eating and drinking difficulties
- Self – care and independence
- Above average levels of deprivation and involvement of social care and other agencies

As a result of this we intend to spend the money in the following ways

Description	Cost
Occupational Therapy 2.5 days	£27,833
Additional Speech and Language therapy 4 days	£44, 613
Family Lead 2 days and resources	£ 20,000
Dramatherapy 1 day	£ 8,000
Communication resources	£1258

The impact of the pupil premium will be measured in terms of pupils' progress and achievement

in relation to

- whether or not pupils meet the SCERTS targets set.
- attainment as shown through CASPA data in June 2017
- evidence relating to individual interventions targeting specific areas of need
- evidence from parents of demonstrable success in understanding and meeting their children's needs
- a reduction in dysregulated behaviour evident through the analysis of systems of recording and reporting

The spending and outcomes will be reviewed at the end of the summer term 2019.
