

Pupil Premium Strategy 2017-18

For the academic year 2017-18 The Garden school received £96, 250.

The main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils at the school are many and complex and include those relating to their autism and also to their family circumstances

- Communication and language skills (social communication and interaction)
- Ability to self-regulate and sensory needs
- Eating and drinking difficulties
- Self – care and independence
- Above average levels of deprivation and involvement of social care and other agencies

As a result of this we intend to spend the money in the following ways

Description	Cost
Occupational Therapy 2.5 days	£27, 156
Additional Speech and Language therapy 4 days	£43,452
Family Lead 3 days	£25,642

The impact of the pupil premium will be measured in terms of pupils' progress and achievement

in relation to

- pupils meeting the SCERTS targets set in IEPs
- attainment as shown through CASPA data in June 2017
- evidence relating to individual interventions targeting specific areas of need
- evidence from parents of demonstrable success in understanding and meeting their children's needs
- a reduction in dysregulated behaviour evident through the analysis of systems of recording and reporting

The spending and outcomes will be reviewed at the end of the summer term 2018.
